DEED OF DECLARATION OF PUBLIC TRUST

This Deed of Declaration of Public Trust executed at Anakkal on 15.10.1941 by the Present Bishop of Diocese of Changanassery, Mar James Kalacherry, aged 49, S/o Kunjacoban and Philomina, residing at Bishop House, Changanassery (hereinafter called SETTLOR)

WHEREAS St. Dominic's Forane Church, Kanjichapally was unable to fulfill needs of the devotees and on the request of the parishioners as well as the request of St. Dominic's Forane Church a new Church was established by the Catholic Diocese of Changanassery as per the Decree dated 10-10-1941.

WHEREAS the Settlor, with the object of constituting and establishing a public Religious and charitable trust for the objects herein mentioned, hereby settles upon trust Rs. 100/- (Rupees One hundred only) as nucleus of the Trust property and made over the same to the Trust viz. 'St. Antony's Church, Anakkal' to hold the same together with all additions and accretions thereto and all other properties that may be acquired out of the same or otherwise, and may hereinafter be the subject matter of the trust as trust property which is to be used for the objectives of the trust under the following terms and conditions: -

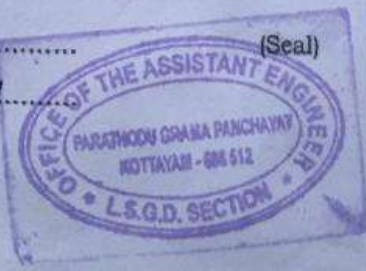

In the second week of June the club members were elected. Kumari Rosann Annie Niju of XI R and Master Avram Joshua of XI Q were elected as the President and Vice President respectively. The club members under the supervision of the teachers-in-charge conducted various competitions from the month June to November, which include:
